



Participant Data Protection Notice

Effective 25th May 2018

This notice explains how & why we collect personal information about you, how we use it and how you can communicate with us about it.

1. Who we are

We are Learn International Education Consultants Ltd. ("Learn International"), based in 17 South Main Street, Naas, Co. Kildare, Ireland. You can contact us by:

We share your information within Learn International to help us provide our services and to comply with regulatory and legal requirements.



2. Our Data Protection Officer

We have not assigned an official Data Protection Officer to the organisation. All Data Protection enquiries can be directed to Cara Simon at cara@learninternational.ie



3. How & why we collect information about you

We collect personal information from you, for example when you sign up to our online platform (Zoho or Google Forms) or purchase one of our programs as a student or a faculty member.

We use cookie technology on our website to provide a great experience for visitors and for analytics. These cookies cannot identify you personally.

Depending on your specific circumstances and requirements it might be necessary to process health related information relating to you. Health information is considered sensitive or "special" data. We treat this information with the extra care it deserves.



4. How we keep your information safe

We keep our computers, files and buildings secure and use up-to-date IT security measures and methods to protect your information.

In order to help keep your information safe, we will request you to identify yourself when you contact us to ask about your information.



5. How long we retain your information for

We keep your personal information for a period of 7 years after you finish being a participant in our programs. The main reason for this particular time frame is due to the requirements of some laws and state bodies. After the 7 years has passed, unless we have a legal obligation or similar valid reason, all your personal information will be deleted.



6. Our Legal Bases for Processing

To use your information lawfully, we rely on one or more of the following legal bases:

- performance of a contract;
- legal obligation;
- protecting the vital interests of you or others;
- public interest;
- our legitimate interests;
- your consent.

In most cases we will need to process your personal data under the "performance of a contract" so we can provide our study abroad programs and our services to you.

To meet our regulatory and legal obligations, we collect your personal information, verify it, keep it up to date, and delete it once we no longer have to keep it.



7. How we use your information

To provide our services & programs under the terms and conditions we agree between us, we need to collect and use personal information about you. If you do not provide this personal information, we may not be able to provide you with our services or programs.

We use information about you to:

- provide our services and programs;
- for administrative purposes;

- identify ways we can improve our services;
- maintain and monitor our services to you;
- protect your interests (e.g. your health & safety and academics);
- protect our interests; and
- meet our legal and regulatory obligations;
- assist universities with their services with us;



8. Consent

Sometimes we need your consent to use your personal information (such as, potentially, for example, your health information). Before giving your consent, we will tell you what information we collect, and what we use it for.

You can remove your consent at any time by contacting us.



9. Your information and third parties

We share your information with third parties. Most of these third parties provide services to help us run our programmes and ensure you have an enjoyable and safe time when you are with us. Other 3rd parties may receive your personal information for reasons such as health, safety and legal reasons.

The categories of third parties we may disclose your information to are:

We expect these third parties to have the same levels of information protection that we have.

We may also have to share information with third parties to meet any applicable law, regulation or lawful request. When we believe we have been given false or misleading information, or we suspect criminal activity we must record this and inform law enforcement agencies.



10. International transfers of data

Our application are operated by EU based companies who store your details in the EU . These platforms provide a level of data protection which is to expected European standards.



11. Your personal information rights

As a participant, you have a range of Data Protection rights which are described below. You can exercise your rights by contacting us at +353 (0)45 939 773, calling into our office, sending us a written request, or by contacting Cara Simon.

For personal data that we have about you:

- You can ask us for a copy of the personal information we hold. You can ask us about how we collect, share and use your personal information. This is known as an access request.
- You can update and correct your personal details.
- You have the right to restrict or object to us using your personal information when certain conditions apply. For example, if we process your information based on “Legitimate Interest”
- You can ask us to delete your personal information **if** it is no longer required by us under regulations, legislation, or if your consent was our only basis for processing.
- Where possible we can share a digital copy of your information directly with you or another organisation. This is known as a data portability request. **Please note that right to data portability does not apply to paper-based records.**

When you contact us to ask about your information, we may ask you to identify yourself. This is to help protect your information.

In general, you are entitled to exercise the rights above free of charge. In certain cases, such as frequent or excessive requests we may charge a fee. If you'd like to learn more about your data protection rights, please visit www.learninternational.ie/dataprotection



12. Making a complaint

If you have a complaint about the use of your personal information, please let a member of staff know. This will give us the opportunity to put things right as quickly as possible.

If you wish to make a complaint you may do so by telephone, in writing or by email.

We ask that you supply as much information as possible to help our staff resolve your complaint quickly.

You also have the right to lodge a complaint with the Data Protection Commission in Ireland at www.dataprotection.ie.
